

# Lunesdale CAMRA Beer Scoring Form for Good Beer Guide 2009

List the pubs in our area (in the map below: a full list may be found at [www.lunesdalecamra.org.uk/pubsetc](http://www.lunesdalecamra.org.uk/pubsetc)) which you have visited in 2007. Next to each name, give what you think is the average score for the beer quality in that pub. List bad pubs as well as good – that's what the low scores are for. If you run out of space, use another sheet of paper. We cannot submit pubs outside our area for the guide. If you wish to recommend such a pub, or ask that it be excluded, contact the pub's local branch.

Beer quality is naturally of the first importance in a Good Beer Guide. Nevertheless, if you feel that a pub is especially suitable or unsuitable for the Guide for other reasons, then either write your reasons on the blank space on this form, or enclose a separate sheet of paper with your reasons, or come along to the selection meeting on Tuesday 5 February at 8pm at Merchant's, Lancaster.

The beer quality scores are as follows:

0 = Undrinkable: No cask ale or the quality is so poor you can't finish it.

1 = Poor: Barely drinkable

2 = Average: Competently kept but uninspiring.

3 = Good: Good beer in good form. Worth another pint.

4 = Very Good: Excellent beer in excellent condition, another pint is a must.

5 = Perfect: Very rarely given by the seasoned drinker. Probably the best beer you are likely to find.

Fractional scores, if you wish to use them, are permitted. Do not, however, give a score which is not a number between 0 and 5 (do not use -1, 3+, A\*, 5½, etc).
